

### COVID-19 Infection Control Program Phase 1 Requirements – On-campus Employees & Students

#### Requirements to Return-to-Campus

All students, employees, or visitors who arrive on campus must:

- Check-in/out here: [staff](#) and [students](#)
- Maintain a minimum of 6 feet of distance from all other people, at all times while on campus
- Wear a face covering over the mouth and nose, at all times while on campus – if an individual does not have a face covering, contact your COVID-19 Site Supervisor to be provided one. **Note:** A face mask (also called a surgical mask, procedure mask, or other similar terms) on a patient or other sick person should not be confused with PPE for a worker; the mask acts to contain
